What is USDA Foods Processing?

If you are interested in processing USDA Foods for schools in more than one state that would classify your company as a multi-state processor. Multi-state processors are required to apply for National Processing Agreement Program (NPA) to process USDA Foods for State and Recipient Agencies. If you are a single state processor, meaning you only process and do business in only one state, your State Agency can assist you in getting started.
