



## Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Fiscal Year (FY) 2021 Maximum Allotment Amounts for Alaska, Hawaii, Guam, and U.S. Virgin Islands

The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 signed by President Joseph R. Biden on March 11, 2021, extends increases to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) maximum allotments from July 1, 2021, through September 30, 2021. The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, raised maximum allotments to 115 percent of the June 2020 value of the Thrifty Food Plan (TFP) from January 1, 2021, through June 30, 2021.

These tables give maximum allotments for various household sizes for January 1, 2021 through September 30, 2021.
