



Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Fiscal Year (FY) 2021 Maximum Allotment Amounts for Alaska, Hawaii, Guam, and U.S. Virgin Islands

The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, signed by President Donald J. Trump on December 27, 2020, increases Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits by raising maximum allotments to 115 percent of the June 2020 value of the Thrifty Food Plan (TFP).

These tables give maximum allotments for various household sizes for January 1, 2021 through June 30, 2021.
